5. TenTen Print Project

The artist agreed by the Committee at the November meeting has accepted the Commission. The GAC Director met with the artist and began discussions about the subject and production method. In response to a number of questions about the title, size and production, Eliza Gluckman will be able to confirm all these at the next meeting in July. The Committee was very supportive of the progress to date.

6. Waltham Forest Borough of Culture: GAC collaboration

The Committee was informed of the upcoming collaboration with Waltham Forest for the Waltham Forest Borough of Culture as initiated by the Mayor of London in 2019. The GAC will lend 68 works of art to 28 different locations between April and September in 2019 to be included in the Ways of Seeing exhibition. Two significant sculptural works by Rachael Whiteread and Cornelia Parker will be on display at Vestry House Museum until September 2019 and the opening two weeks will see Mel Brimfield's, Prepared Pianola for Roger Bannister installed in the Walthamstow Shopping Mall. The official opening of the Ways of Seeing exhibition will be attended by the Minister of Arts, Heritage and Tourism.

7. Update on the Move to Old Admiralty Building (OAB)

As OAB will not be ready for occupation until the autumn, the Collection is currently being moved into temporary storage. The team will be located temporarily at DCMS, moving there on 18 April. The Committee raised a query about access to the gallery and the need for planning to manage potential queues. The GAC presented ideas for the gallery programme: the life and history of the Collection, guided tours, weekday opening hours and informed the Committee that a further detailed plan will be circulated in due course.

8. Directors report of GAC activities since 14 November 2018

- The Director presented the new logo, which received a very positive response from the Committee.
- The GAC will organise a guided tour for the Advisory Committee of Old Admiralty Building in September or October, depending on the state of the building.
